

Which one is a relief and which one is a sculpture? How do you know?






Is Palissy's plate a sculpture or a relief? How do you know?



Radial Balance: elements repeated evenly around the center of the piece



Fauvism


Fauve - French for "Wild Beast"

- Art movement in early 1900's
- Non-descriptive, pure colors
- Use color to show emotional response to nature

Non-Descriptive Color - does not represent the


natural color of an object

What do cool colors make you feel?




What do warm colors make you feel?



Let's talk about wax resist

Wax Resist - a layer of waxy material that will prevent a water-based material (paint, watercolor) from sticking to its surface
